### PLAYGROUP PROMISE (charter)

And have it as part of our wall display.

**Article 28**-all children have a right to education (by being at our setting you are being educated)

**Article 29**-education should develop each child's personality and talents and should encourage children to respect their parents and cultures (the promise should be carried through into every day life)

**Article 30**-all children have the right to learn (we do this through play)

**Article 31**- all children have the right to play and join in a wide range of activities (we are a very play based setting)

**Article 12**- children have the right to say what they think (the charter has been compiled with the children)

The charter also links with the government's EYFS guidelines and focuses primarily on personal, social and emotional development
